The Craft Council of BC has invited Debra Sloan to present a talk about her twelve-month residency in 2018 at the UBC Museum of Anthropology where she was studying and responding to the Anabaptist, Faenza and Delftware held in the Koerner European Ceramic Gallery collection.

At the heart of the collection is the Haban ware, made by the Anabaptists, who fled Florence due to religious persecution. Dr Koerner's collection goes beyond gathering together related objects and instead expresses his philosophical outlook of religious freedom and pacifism, through the objects that he surrounded himself with during his lifetime—important messages in this time of worldwide migration.
